Ornithogalum saundersiae

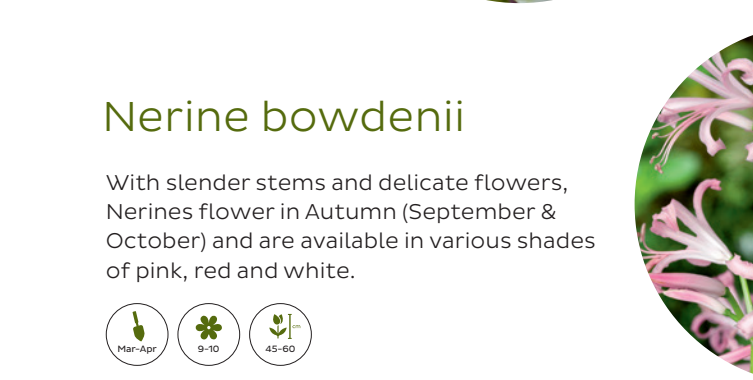
Also known as the Cape Star of Bethlehem. They produce ivory-white, star-shaped flowers. Flowering in July and September, they add a charming accent to the garden.

Amaryllis belladonna

Not to be confused with Hippeastrum, these Amaryllis bear pink flowers produced in late summer and early autumn. They can survive the European winter if covered with leaves or straw.



Nerine bowdenii

With slender stems and delicate flowers, Nernes flower in Autumn (September & October) and are available in various shades of pink, red and white.

Galtonia

A genus of flowering bulbs with white, pendulous flowers in the asparagus family. Also known as the Cape Hyacinth.

Eremurus

The imposing height of these summer bloomers make them very striking in public spaces. Flowering in June-July, they are a beautiful addition to a garden or landscape and create vertical interest.

Dichelostemma congestum

Beautiful flowering plants originating from Western America. They belong to the Asparagaceae family and produce tall stems adorned with clusters of blue flowers. They are beautiful planted among grasses and in a prairie garden.

Tigridia

Flowering from July to September, Tigridias are commonly known as Tiger flowers because some varieties have tiger-like markings on their petals.

SUMMER FLOWERING BULBS



Summer-flowering bulbs

Summer-flowering bulbs produce beautiful flowers in the summer months. These bulbous plants are often colourful and diverse, making them popular choices for grass strips of land, flower beds, borders and tubs. Our top 15 summer flowering bulbs are:



1

Dahlia

Striking flowers in different shapes and colours. They generally flower from summer through to the first frost of the year.



Lily

Curved petals and the flowers are often spotted. Flowering between June and August, they are hardy and ideal for naturalising. The oriental types are also highly scented.

Gladiolus

Gladioli are graceful flowers with long stems and striking flower spikes, available in various colours and commonly used in plantings due to their elegance and vibrant appearance.

Zantedeschia

Zantedeschias, also known as Calla Lilies, are summer bloomers with striking, funnel-shaped flowers and large heart-shaped leaves. They are native to Southern Africa and are appreciated for their attractive appearance in gardens.

Crocosmia

Striking flowers in shades of red, orange and yellow. They add a fiery accent to the summer garden from July onwards and can last into October, weather permitting.

Eucomis

Also known as Pineapple Lilies because of the shape of their flower clusters. They have striking flowers and an exotic appearance. Flowering throughout the summer, they are available in different varieties.

Acidanthera Murielae

Also known as Gladiolus murielae, they produce elegant white flowers with a striking dark heart. These plants flower in August and September and have a very pleasant scent.

Liatris spicata

Distinctive, elongated flower spikes with tubular flowers. They flower in July and August and often attract butterflies.
